Dear Parents,

Welcome to the last update of the half term.

Jubilee Day – Pilgrims of Hope

Miss Sitkowski organised a great range of activities for the children to participate in throughout today in honour of the Jubilee Year. You may wish to talk to your child about what they did so here is an outline of some of the things they took part in:

Jar of Hope activity: As it is the year of hope, each class thought

about things they hope for within the world. What would make it a better or perfect place? What do you wish you could change about it? What would make everyone happier? They wrote their ideas onto strips of coloured paper of card which were folded up and then put into the jar. The jars will now be placed on the class prayer tables for the year and every time we pray we can think about the things we hope for.

Holy/ Jubilee Class Doors: Children chose a story from the Bible and drew the picture of it onto a piece of paper which were then stuck to each classroom door to create our own holy/ Jubilee doosr.

World Statistics Activity: A range of statistics were shared with the children such as 703 million people do not have access to safe drinking water, 2 billion people do not have access to a household toilet and 675 million people have no access to electricity. These were discussed with the children and we then talked about the work different charities do to help. They then discussed as a class what they think we could do to help such as raise money, pray for these people, not waste things we have, don't be greedy, and share this information with others so that they can do the same. These ideas will be gathered together for the school council to share at their next meeting. You may also like to think about things you could do with your child at home.

Safer Internet Day

On Tuesday, it was Safer Internet Day. This day is celebrated every year, to promote the safety and wellbeing of everyone online. In our growing technological world, it is so important we educate all children on this too. This year, the focus was on being able to spot and protect yourself from a scam. The children watched an online national assembly and then completed activities in their computing lessons linked to this. Nursery

We have been learning: We have been counting objects 1 to 5 (or more) in order. You can help at home by: continuing to do this with your child at home.

Reception

We have been learning: about African masks.

You can help at home by: helping your child to draw or make an African mask and talk about the different patterns around us.

Year 1

We have been learning: to share amounts equally. You can help at home by: practicing sharing amounts into groups of 2, 5 or 10.

Year 2

Year 3

We have been learning: about Egyptian agriculture.

Year 5

We have been learning: about internet safety. You can help at home by: asking your child how they can stay safe online.

We have been learning: about sea kelp forests as part of our English unit based on the 'Hidden Forest'.

You can help at home by: asking your child about the 4 topics they have researched: facts about these forests, creatures that live in them, threats and possible solutions.
