Important Information about Free School Meals – checking before 31st March 2025

There are some changes coming into effect from 1st April in regard to eligibility for free school meals (not universal free school meals which will remain unchanged).

If you think you are eligible for free school meals but are not currently claiming, then please see the school office who will be able to run a check for you. **It is vital this takes place before 31st March.** It the check comes back 'true' before this date, your child will remain eligible for free school meals until they leave us in Y6. This is why it is important to do this now, even if your child receives universal free school meals (which is anyone in Reception, Y1 and Y2). Please see the attached form to complete and return by 21st March, this will give us time to send off for your information to be checked.

If the result comes back 'true' from 1st April onwards, your child will only be eligible for free school meals as long as the result remains 'true'. Checks must be run throughout the school year, meaning some children **may not** be eligible for free school meals for the duration of their time with us.

This applies to children in nursery too, so please do ask for a check to be run before 31st March.

Learning at St Louis

Nursery

We have been learning: about Science during 'National Science Week'. We have been learning how things can move using air, e.g. making paper rockets then blowing through a straw to see how the rocket moves across the table.

You can help at home by: practising this and talking to your child about it.

Reception

We have been learning: about Spring. We went on a walk around school to find the signs of Spring.

You can help at home by: taking your child for a walk and hunting for signs of Spring.

Year 1

We have been learning: about length and height. You can help at home by: comparing the length of objects in your home.

Year 2

We have been learning: about growing up by looking at the life cycle of a chick and visiting the eggs/chicks in Reception.

You can help at home by: looking at the lifecycle of other animals and comparing it to the chicks.

Year 3

We have been learning: how to use short division.

You can help at home by: practicing simple division problems with your child, using everyday objects or scenarios.

Year 4

We have been learning: about villages by the sea, what might attract tourists and writing a tourist brochure as part of our English lessons.

You can help at home by: asking what your child's ideas are to attract people to a small fishing village.

Year 5

We have been learning: about Fairtrade.

You can help at home by: asking your child to look out for any items with the Fairtrade symbol and ask why Fairtrade is important.

Year 6

We have been learning: about the Gods that the Ancient Maya believed in.

You can help at home by: asking your child about the different Maya Gods.
