# Nursery

We have been learning: about people who help us in our community, this week our main focus was bus drivers.

You can help at home by: talking to your child about bus drivers and how they help to get us to places.

# Reception

We have been learning: new sounds including the trigraph 'igh'.

You can help at home by: asking your child to write some words with the sounds they have learnt e.g. rain, light, feet, goat.

#### Year 1

We have been learning: our number bonds to 20.

You can help at home by: giving your child a number and asking them what they add to it to make 20.

You can help at home by: seeing what facts your child can remember about him.

We have been learning: about different types of applied force.

You can help at home by: asking your child to give examples of actions that demonstrate pushing, pulling or both.

We have been learning: about the battle of Bosworth.

You can help at home by: asking your child to outline the battle and the reasons Richard III lost.

# Year 5

We have been learning: about South America.

You can help at home by: asking your child which countries make up the continent.

#### Year 6

We have been learning: about lines of longitude and latitude.

You can help at home by: asking your child to recall some of the facts they have learned.
