### **Lenten Reflection**

In their chapel visit this week, the children heard scripture where God told the disciples to listen to Jesus. As we all prepare for Easter throughout Lent, we were thinking of ways we can listen to Jesus. Here are some ideas:

- We can hear Jesus speak to us through readings from the Gospels.
- We can hear Jesus speak to us through those who care about us: family members who keep us safe and happy; teachers who help us learn; priests and nuns who help us to know God; and friends who are kind to us.
- We can hear Jesus in our hearts; not in the way we hear someone speaking to us through our ears. Jesus speaks to us when we think about ways we can help someone in need, or when we think of a person who needs our prayers.
- Another special way we can hear Jesus is through prayer. Prayer is a conversation. In prayer just like in any conversation we have with our friends, we talk to Jesus and listen to him in our hearts. Let's talk and listen to Jesus now as we join with our prayers of intercession.

# Reception

We have been learning: how to write a simple sentence. We know we need a capital letter at the beginning, finger spaces and a full stop at the end.

You can help at home by: encouraging your child to write a simple sentence e.g. I can see a cat.

### Year 1

We have been learning: how to make colours lighter and darker.

You can help at home by: allowing your child to mix black and white paint into other colours to make them lighter or darker.

### Year 2

We have been learning: about Lent during our RE lessons.

You can help at home by: speaking to your child about the special days in Lent - Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday.

### Year 3

We have been learning: different ways of describing a setting e.g. simile, 2 Ad sentence, Ad same Ad sentence.

You can help at home by: asking your child to write down a sentence describing Egypt and the strategy they used to write it.

### Year 4

We have been learning: about how plastic pollution is a huge issue and how it impacts the sea.

You can help at home by: asking your children to recite the poem they have written about this issue.

### Year 5

We have been learning: the formal written method to multiply.

You can help at home by: asking your child to multiply a 2 digit number by a 2 digit number and explain the method.

### Year 6

We have been learning: about what foods were important to the Maya.

You can help at home by: asking what different types of farming techniques the Maya used.
