Well done to several of our children who have been achieving some fantastic things outside of school too.



Learning at St Louis



Reception

We have been learning: how to recognise and name 2D shapes.

You can help at home by: taking your child on a shape hunt to find 2D shapes around your house.

Year 1

We have been learning: about money.

You can help at home by: identifying different coins. Can your child add some of them together?

You can help at home by: asking your child to read the time on an analogue clock and convert it to a 24 hour digital time.

We have been learning: to use four quadrant co-ordinate grids in maths.

You can help at home by: asking your child whether the \times and y co-ordinates are positive or negative in each of the four quadrants.
