Learning at St Louis



Reception

We have been learning: how to blend sounds together to be able to read a word. You can help at home by: asking your child to say the sounds in cvc words and blend them together to read the word e.g. cat, mat, red, net, dog.

Year 1

We have been learning: about toys older than our own.

You can help at home by: sharing pictures and talking to your child about toys you liked to play with during your childhood. You could even encourage them to ask their grandparents/other family members.

Year 2

We have been learning: about the fractions $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$

You can help at home by: asking your child to find a fraction of a shape or amount.

Year 3

We have been learning: to use speech marks (inverted commas) in our writing, to show when a character is talking.

You can help at home by: identifying speech marks in books and talking about what the characters are saying and how they say it.

Year 4

We have been learning: about non-chronological reports and what features they included.

You can help at home by: asking your child what they wrote about and what facts they learnt.

Year 5

We have been learning: about some of the reasons for the fall of the Roman Empire. You can help at home by: asking your child which reason they think had the greatest impact.

Year 6

We have been learning: how to round decimals in maths.

You can help at home by: asking what to do when rounding a decimal to the nearest tenth.
